The town of Seabrook was first founded in 2004 by Casey and Laura Roloff and has affectionately become known as Washington's Beach Town by locals and visitors alike. Inspired by Seaside, Florida, Seabrook was built with a foundation of new urbanism design where homes, shops, and restaurants are now seamlessly woven into a scenic bluff overlooking the Pacific Ocean

Seabrook features over 450 homes
throughout several neighborhoods,
numerous merchants, 18 parks, a Town Hall,
Montessori-inspired school, and countless
other amenities. Seabrook is an ideal place
to call home, to stay in a vacation rental, or
to visit for a coastal day-trip.


TAKE IN THE BEAUTY OF RUBY BEACH

SPEND A DAY AT ROOSEVELT BEACH




As good stewards of the land, Seabrook has been working to bring light back into the forest in many ways, from partnering with the professional




